

- **DAILY PROGRAMME:**

We follow a structured programme that is up in the classes and every term we will give you the themes for the different weeks. This helps you with the artwork and the line of thought that your child is following.

Creative work is done daily at school and is almost done on a one on one basis with the teacher. This allows for individual attention and to also make sure that the child has grasped the skills that they are learning.

Every week the children will paint, glue, cut, tear amongst other things so that the children get as much exposure as possible to these little fine motor skills to form the foundations going forward.

Bakerman

On Wednesday / Thursdays we do bakerman where your child gets an opportunity to bake at home and he/she is the “baker” offering their treats. Your child will also remind you of this. Each child gets roughly 2 turns per year, so please make an effort with your child when it is their turn. Baking at school/ Tuck shop
